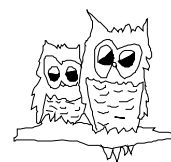

Weekly Learning Activities

Step into Liverpool: History of Liverpool

Use the PowerPoint attached as a resource to research and learn about Liverpool's transport, its transport system and how it has changed and developed over time.



1. Pick a certain type of transport or a specific introduction to the system from a year and create your own drawing/model of this. E.g. a model railway station or airport drawing.
2. Use resource sheet to complete relevant activities about Liverpool's canals and narrow boats.
