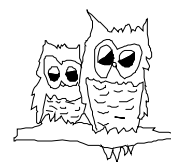
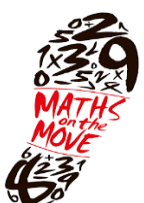
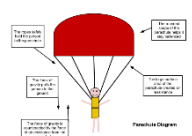

1 The country will join together to celebrate the 75th anniversary of VE day on 8th May, so the activities below this week will provide opportunities for you to learn more about VE day. 4 Wartime Recipes With one rationed egg and a packet of powdered milk in the larder, WWII's home cooks had to be creative. Find out what families were eating over 75 years ago. Free choice Have a go at these challenges! -create a key words dictionary of subjects we have studied so far -write a play/story/poem or music based on any of these topics -do a garden/outside project: grow something, build a den, bug house, bird house, study and photograph species that you can see -research something in your local area – buildings, nature, transport, etc. -practice and play sports, music or other hobbies with your family -try to learn a new skill How many of the following challenges can you do?
