Seaside In A Bottle

Supplies

- Plastic water bottle
- Sand
- Assortment of shells
- Pebbles
- Funnel
- Blue food colouring
- Washing up liquid



- Card
- Fine line pen
- Ribbon or string
- Hole punch



- 1 Using a funnel, pour sand into the plastic bottle until it is $\frac{1}{4}$ full.



- 5 Screw the lid tightly onto the bottle. Now place it on its side and allow the contents to settle. You should end up with your very own seaside scene!



- 2 Now choose objects to make your seaside scene! We used shells and pebbles.



- 6 Now make a tag for your bottle. Using scissors, cut out a small rectangular shape from the card. Then use a hole punch to make a hole at one end. We stained ours with tea to make it look old.



- 3 Add a few drops of blue food colouring and washing up liquid to the water.



- 7 Using a fine line pen, write a message such as 'My Seaside in a bottle' onto the tag.



- 4 Top the bottle up with water, again using the funnel to pour.



- 8 Thread a length of ribbon or wool round the neck of the bottle and tie the tag on to it.

Seaside In A Bottle



Supplies

- Plastic water bottle
- Sand
- Assortment of shells

Step 1. Using a funnel, pour sand into the plastic bottle until it is $\frac{1}{4}$ full.



Step 2. Now choose objects to make your seaside scene! We used shells and pebbles.



Step 3. Add a few drops of blue food colouring and washing up liquid to the water.



Step 4. Top the bottle up with water, again using the funnel to pour.



Step 5. Screw the lid tightly onto the bottle. Now place it on its side and allow the contents to settle. You should end up with your very own seaside scene!



Step 6. Now make a tag for your bottle. Using scissors, cut out a small rectangular shape from the card. Then use a hole punch to make a hole at one end. We stained ours with tea to make it look old.



Step 7. Using a fine line pen, write a message such as 'My Seaside in a bottle' onto the tag.



Step 8. Thread a length of ribbon or wool round the neck of the bottle and tie the tag on to it.
